Duke Mansion is the most expensive and probably the best known building designed by Horace Trumbauer in New York. This Palatial Residential Architect's work is now the home to NYU's Institute of Fine Art. Specialty contractor Urban D.C. was hired by New York University's Department of Design and Construction to complete a full restoration of the facade, roof and skylights.

The limestone exterior required extensive cleaning and repair. The mansion's main ornamental architectural elements including the entablature and the window architraves required replacement or sculpting-in-place. Missing elements were fabricated and installed. Historic mortars were matched. The terracotta roof tile was replaced, along with decorative copper. New historic skylights were fabricated and installed. The final scope of work included restoration of the bluestone sidewalk.
